Sign Language: Pilot

Materials Included:

Sign Language Sheet for Child Notebook

Pilot: Make a forward-upward sweeping motion with the right Y hand which also has its index finger extended. *Add the sign for person: hold both flat open hands to the front with palms facing; then move them down simultaneously.*

Print the Sign Language Sheet for Child Notebook and place one in each child's binder.

Show the children how to perform the sign language and allow them to practice it over and over again.

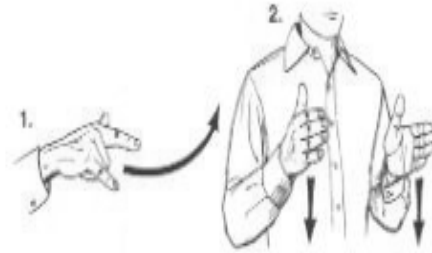
Materials Needed:
